CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP

Tan Hunnable, scoring 8 pts. from the 9 round 'Swiss' tournament has won the 1977/1978 Wanstead & Woodford Club Championship. He was undefeated conceeding just two draws and finished 1½ pts. shead of Michael Bird and Terry Whitton on 6½. A multiple tie for 4th & 5th prizes involved George Fernie, Alan Potter, Tony Clark and Simon Lee, all with 6 pts. This is a particularly fine performance by 11 year old Simon Lee, to make the prize list at his first attempt, having gained the right to enter through winning last seasons Junior Championship.

An original entry of 36 players set out on the Championship trail last September, and with the names of Philip Gasper, Alan Marehall, Paul Smith and David Hick missing from the line-up, this year's tourmament promised to be more open than some in recent seasons.

As many as six players held the lead either jointly or alone at various stages (from rd. 3 enwards), and the new champion did not join the leaders until round 6. But his performance in the second helf of the tournament of five straight wins disposed of all challengers. Michael Bird again attained a high placing — his last three championships read: 2nd, =6th, =2nd. Bill Franklin must be considered the unluckiest player: he had to play each of the top six and missed the prize he deserved by ½ pt.

This year's tournament produced the remarkably low total of just 16 draws from a theoretical maximum of 162 games. The event was again ably controlled by Alan Mershell.



David Hick, invited to play, was discovered at the last moment to be in New Zeeland. Imagine our jaw-dropping surprise when he walked in! This amezing match therefore got under way with our ranks full - but not an opponent in sight? - they were still in the pub (they live up to their name). Everybody had at least three in hand on their clock to start with (except Andrew, who had white and spent at least 10 minutes on his first move). The Knights drifted in, in ones and twos with their captain turning up last! Believe it or not, they were promotion candidates and needed a heavy win in this match to achieve their goal. More surprising still, that they should conceed two boards by default.

Now to the play. Alan Marshall was on the verge of discovering that his position was distinctly difficult when Staples transposed moves leaving a fatal weakness in front of his king. David Hick won again when his opponent lost his way and sacrificed unsoundly. By adjournment we had reached 42 pts. with Three games still in play. But amazingly (in keeping with this amazing match) they all appeared to be losing. The best of the three was Terry Whitton's and he was a piece down, but not without chances. His opponent failed to appear at resumption, giving us the match. It turned out he had sealed a blunder!
