In the games that ended up on the right side, Bill Franklin won emphatically and Matthew Shew after picking up a piece early coasted to his win. Terry Whitten played Ivor Smith well and may have had some advantage when agreeing the draw.

And one that was nearly a throw eway: Ien Munnable had a material advantage in return for a cramped position but blundered late on. Cutler however in face of some rook checks repeated the position rather than risk running his king into trouble; the risk, on analysis, turned out to be illusory?

He left the board after moving, thinking White had walked right into his carefully laid plan. When George returned he found a white knight on b8. "What's he played N-N0 for?" thought George. "Ch no! I had a rook on that equare!"

despite having played few games this season, and won queen for rook and bighop with a powerful attack. Roy Wagstaff picked up the exchange but was taken to adjournment before his opponent gave in.

Some of the 1's could have been 1's, but with no losses, this represents our biggest win in the Landon League this season.

The unfinished match against Drunken Knights hung on one adjourned game which went hunnable 0 - Staples 1. By winning ending was just that, but somehow, despite sesing two winning alternatives, I managed to walk into a mating trap. Staples was so embarrassed at having perpetrated such a swindle, he promptly bought me a pint! So its W & W 4½ - D. Kts. 5½. Sorry fellers!

We now have $3\frac{1}{2}$ from 7 matches, which places us about half way up (or down!) the table. But we have since lost heavily to Athenseum.

Ng4 looks to have a lot of nuisence value in the long run. 12 ... Nxd4: 13 8xd4, 8c6: 14 e5, Glack later said he had overlocked that White can play this here. Nevertheless White's supposed K-side attack still isn't off the ground. 14 ... Nd7: 15 Ge2. In the long run the queen is better placed here than the superficially attractive o4. 15 ... Bxf8: 27 Rxf8+ Qxf8: 28 8xf8, Kxf8: 29 Kq1, Ke7: 30 Kf2, e5: 31 q3, Ke6: Slack is sure he's won here — and he should be. 32 Ke3, Bq2: 33 h4, h5: 34 Kf2, Bh1: 35 Nd1, Hoping to get the knight into play on e3. 35 ... Bd5: 36 b4, Bb3: 37 No3. Kf5: 38 a5. The start of White's Houdini act. All his pawns are weak and Black is clearly going to win. 38 a5 releases the knight. More importantly,

with Black again in time trouble, White is trying 4 mock attack to divert his attention. Utterly unacumd, it works like a dresm. 30 ... 8c2; (Maybe 38 ... 8c4 is needed here - ad.) 39 b5, 8d3; 40 bxa6, 8xa6; 47 b2. Again attack at all costs. 41 ... 8c4; About here I began to small escape - Black's apparently been mucking about quite a while to little effect. The Q-side pawn majority is now dangerous. 42 b5, Ke6; 43 Ke3, Kd6; This is the crucial stage of the game. Black thought he was home and dry as did the spectators, but he's still got a hurdle to get ever. 44 Ke4, Ke5? Black played this quickly without realising the problems. (44 ... 96 seems to be the move - ed.) 45 s6; bxa6; 46 bxa6, 8xa6; 47 Kxe5, 8d3; 48 Nd5, 8c2; The sealed move at the end of the second session, and I think a bad one. Black said he thought it was a certain draw - but that's because he totally missed the rather obvious continuation. In fact with a different sealed move, he could have made life much more difficult. Se2 or g6 better. (But Black must be losing now, his King's on the wrong side of the board - ed.) 49 Nf4, Bd1; 50 Ne6+ Kc6; 51 Nxq7, Kd7; 52 Kf5, Ke7; 53 Kq5, Kf7; 54 Nxh5, and Black RESIGNED on move 68.
