LOW (<5)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Club stewards/event organisers may accept risk Manage by routine processes Hazard to be reviewed and updated at least quarterly.
MEDIUM (5-12)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Committee action required to control risk as soon as reasonably practicable Monitor any action taken to ensure it has been effective in reducing the risk to an acceptable level according to degree of impact on attendees Review arrangements for ventilation and room lay out on session by session basis. Hazard to be reviewed and updated at least monthly to ensure risk level remains acceptable.
HIGH (>12)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Immediate Committee action required to further control risk Likelihood of need to cease club meetings Notify insurers Monitor any action taken to ensure it has been effective in reducing the risk to an acceptable level Hazard to be reviewed and updated at least every month to ensure controls remain effective
