The introduction of the Rule of 6 restrictions in mid-September 2020 and the further tiered levels of increased risk status in mid-October did not result in any material changes in the advice of HM Government in respect of youth (to age 25) or children's activities in out of school settings (to age 18). The Winter Plan and revised Tiers effective from 2nd December 2020 envisage activities for under 18s regardless of tier. Under Stage 2 of the Spring Plan all youth activities able to resume indoors from 12 April; Covid-19 testing of school children is now in place and free lateral flow tests available to all adults. The Club adopts practices for the workplace for its volunteers including ventilation, sanitisation, social distancing, use of face coverings and handling contaminated objects as set out in the 28th August 2020 assessment.
